The Duke Center for Spirituality, Theology and Health offers the Templeton Postdoctoral Fellows of the Society for Spirituality, Theology & Health full-time in-house position that is designed to provide intensive training and mentoring for research leadership and faculty service. The salary for the fellowship is \$45,000, plus the applicable institutional fringe benefit package, with an additional \$5,000 in research funds, each for two years. Fellow will begin work between July and September 2010. The fellow will be expected to do the following:

DEFINITION AND EXPECTATION:

Under the guidance/ mentorship of the CSTH faculty put forward an independent (qualitative, quantitative or combine) research project, obtain appropriate IRB approvals/permissions and submit full proposal for research funding. Research plan must be sufficiently developed to be ready for IRB submission at the beginning of fellowship.

Publish at least 1 manuscript and present at least 1 paper or poster of research or scholarship during the period of appointment, in his/her particular area of interest in another area of STH research.

Participate in fellows meetings with mentors and visiting scholars.

Attend STH Seminars and Community of Scholars meetings.

Provide assistance with Center activities, to include ongoing Center research projects, and activities related to the Society (particularly the e-newsletter).

Open timely discussion with mentor regarding all facets of research activities.

Conformance to standards of responsible conduct in research. Compliance with all applicable University and departmental policies and procedures.

Work with CSTH administrative staff for guidance on expenditure of research funds.

QUALIFICATIONS:

The Postdoctoral Appointee holds a PhD or equivalent doctorate (e.g. ScD, MD, PsyD). Candidates with non-US degrees may be required to provide proof of degree equivalency.

Note to international candidates: Generally, immigration classifications (e.g., H-1B, J-1, etc.) require that the requisite degree be conferred before a petition can be filed or a visa document issued to sponsor the individual.
